





Introducing the project and sharing some of the headlines

Me My Family My Home – the last year of work

- Funded by the DfE
- 6 areas, one IC team site support person, 30 days of time per site
- Supporting 'children and young people with complex support needs and complicated home/family lives
- No big training programme, mainly mentoring and co-working
- No toolkit simply 'a framework for keeping it simple'






- Build a vision of what you are wanting to achieve
- Extend the invitation to community people not just those from service land
- Co-produce Coproduce!




a Framework for Keeping it Simple





key messages

- If we are honest this was a project about supporting children, young people and families who the system has failed
- The complexity of the system means it will forever fail families unless it is simplified and unless children and young people are put at the centre
- Silos of service health, education and social care often simply act as a forum for arguments about who does what.....and every argument simply illustrates how un-person centred we are

'Oh, you're sure to do that,' said the Cat, 'if you only walk long enough


The approach we took in Leicester





- make the processes work
- flexible support
- no assumptions: positive and possible
- community first
- listen listen
- more than just money



"Search for capacities, seek connections, be open to yes...."
What would it take?

What have we learned?

Start with ordinary: if it was my son or daughter or friend, what would my response be?

Plan for a solution, not for planning's sake

Believe in and trust young people and families to know their solutions - indeed expect it (ask the 'what would it take?' question)

Change doesn't happen simply by telling workers to do things differently, or even just with training. The modelling and mentoring approach is key, as is the freedom and support for workers to try something different

What have we learned?

The system is a great big creaking oil tanker that needs to be turned. Each one of us is a *trim tab* in that process

There are going to be things you need to do differently (processes, policies etc etc). Sort this out as quickly and as efficiently as possibleand with a clear sense of, 'if this was me and my son or daughter, would it be clear and straightforward to navigate?'

Be brave about how Council money is spent

Keep sharing the learning - the stories of different and better lives. There is nothing more powerful


questions and discussion
